The Presenters

Ben Thomas, PhD, MSc(Hons), RMN, RGN, DipN(Lond)RNT, Cert HE, FRCN

Dr. Thomas is the Director of Mental Health and Learning Disability Nursing in the Professional leadership Team at the Department of Health, England. His portfolio includes the modernization of mental health and learning disability nursing careers; improving access to psychological therapies ;and the development of nursing indicators for mental health and learning disability. Ben is currently on secondment from the National Patient Safety Agency (NPSA) where he is the Head of Mental Health and Learning Disabilities. At the NPSA he is responsible for producing the Good Practice Guidelines on the Independent Investigation of Serious Patient Safety Incidents in Mental Health; the Seven Steps to patient Safety for Mental Health; Resuscitation in mental health and learning disability services and Preventing harm to children from parents with mental health needs. He was instrumental in developing the suicide prevention toolkit for inpatient care. He has held a number of senior clinical, managerial and academic positions both in the UK and in Australia. He has served on a number of ministerial reviews and advisory committees to governments including Malaysia, South Korea, Australia and China.

Kathy Sing

Kathy is a peer support worker who operates out of the Manitoba Schizophrenia Society. Most of her work is done at different facilities including the Selkirk Mental Health Centre and the Health Sciences Centre in Winnipeg.

Catheryn Martens

Catheryn is the Director Health Services for Klinik Community Health Center in Winnipeg. Klinik is an inner city community health center with a 30-year reputation for progressive programming in mental health, primary health care and education. Catheryn is also a private consultant offering patient safety and human resource expertise in Manitoba and across Western Canada. She designed and teaches a curriculum for health care providers to become Critical Incident Investigators. Catheryn has previously held a variety of positions within the WRHA, including Director Patient Safety. Catheryn is a nurse with 37 years experience in the health care system. She holds a BA from the University of Winnipeg with a major in Administrative Studies.
