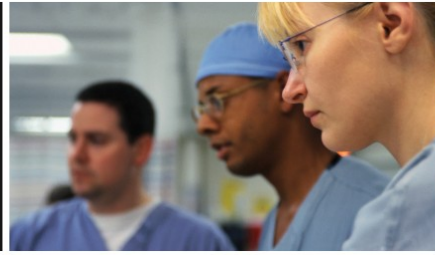

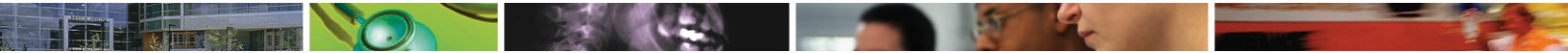

- To gain an understanding of the literature and research linking collaborative practice to positive patient, health care provider, and system outcomes.
- To recognize the role of interprofessional student clinical placements as a catalyst for improving collaboration within the clinical setting.
- To appreciate the evidence of the impact of oral health in achieving positive patient outcomes.
- To identify the potential roles for dentistry on clinical practice teams in the management of systemic inflammation and chronic disease, including the contribution from an oral health perspective and the response to needs from an overall health perspective.
